Day 47 (Leviticus 1-2)

CONSIDERING CONTENT

As you read today, what's the strongest impression or image it leaves in your mind?

What are some common words or phrases that come up several times in your reading today?

What common requirement for an animal sacrifice do you see (1:3,10)?

APPLYING ACTION

What observations do you see about sacrifice and how does that change or enhance your view of Christ sacrificing himself for us?

Leviticus is filled with details regarding our offering/sacrifice. Do you see an application from that for you today?

What idea, verse, or phrase can change my experience today?

Day 48 (Leviticus 3-4)

CONSIDERING CONTENT

What common requirement for the sacrifice animal do you see in 3:1,6 and 4:3,23,28,32?

Why do you think the blood was so important and why was it always needing to be splashed or sprinkled on things?

In 4:2 what was the occasion and purpose for the offering?

What do you see and learn about the role of a priest in these chapters that is different than what you typically think about for a priest?

What was the role of the priest in these offerings/sacrifice? Summarize it into one sentence.

APPLYING ACTION

What does today's first question have to do with the sacrifice Jesus made for us?

What does the importance of the blood say to us about the death of Jesus?

What idea, verse, or phrase can change my experience today?

Day 49 (Leviticus 5-6)

CONSIDERING CONTENT

In 5:2-6 what do you learn about sin? What do you learn about our guild? What do you learn about our responsibility?

What is the purpose of the guilt offering?

Responsibility for our sin sometimes includes action as well. What do you learn at the start of Leviticus 6 about action and responsibilities?

What is the purpose of the burnt offering?

What is the purpose of the grain offering?

What is the purpose of the sin offering?

APPLYING ACTION

After reading about all these different offerings, do you need to change your prayer life at all? Especially in regards to your time of confession?

Does any of your reading change the way you see sin and guilt?

What idea, verse, or phrase can change my experience today?

Day 50 (Leviticus 7-8)

CONSIDERING CONTENT

Please note how often you continue to read about fire and blood in the opening chapters of Leviticus...

Why do you think the priest was able to eat portions of the sacrifices and keep parts of the sacrifice (like the hide in 7:8)?

What do you think was good about having to sacrifice all the different ways that they did? What do you think was hard or not so good about all the sacrificing?

Why do you think Aaron and his sons had to go through such an elaborate ordination? What does it say about their importance?

APPLYING ACTION

In 8:26 it speaks of obedience. What do you think about everything we are reading in Leviticus? And how does it affect obedience of their people?

What idea, verse, or phrase can change my experience today?
